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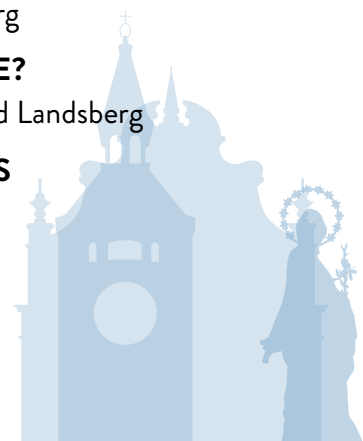
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DID YOU KNOW?

2.629 HOURS OF SUNSHINE

The city's special geographical location between the Alps, the Alpine foothills and Lechfeld means that clouds and rain are mostly diverted, ensuring great holiday weather. Landsberg am Lech is one of the sunniest regions in Germany.

1.254 METRES IN ALTITUDE

have already been covered by the cool, clear waters of the Lech on their way from the river's source to Landsberg, when they rush over the Karolinen weir. Perch, pikeperch, rainbow trout and the king of the Alpine rivers – the redfish – feel at home here. Often, in the early morning hours, you can see fly fishermen casting their lines beneath the Lech weir.

4.000 RAFTS

navigated the Lech weir every year, on average, during the 19th century. For centuries, the Lech River served as a vital thoroughfare. Wood, wine, cotton and even livestock were transported on rafts from the Alps via Landsberg and Augsburg to Vienna and Budapest: no harmless undertaking.



187 STEPS

can be climbed in the Bayertor alone – then there's the Jungfernsprungturm and Mutterturm, and a short ramble to the eastern high bank of the river or a short walk to the Holy Cross Church: you'll soon have 10,000 steps behind you.

82.070 SALT DISCS

arrived in Landsberg in the 17th century – in addition, numerous barrels full of salt, always accompanied by the payment of the 'salt penny'. The historic lifting systems can still be seen in the historic salt stores, the Salzstadel, today.

1.000 CHILDREN

besiege the city every four years during the medieval Ruethen festival. With parades, dances and exuberant camp life, they re-enact the city's historical events.

710 CENTIMETRES

One of the large-scale historical city scenes by the talented Hubert von Herkomer is displayed in the Historic Town Hall. The historical pictures in the ballroom still top this scale. Don't miss it!

243 ARTISTS

display their creativity in a wide variety of art forms. The west bank of Lake Ammersee and the city of Landsberg have long inspired artists in their work. Numerous galleries and diverse art associations regularly hold high-profile exhibitions.

LANDSBERG IN A DAY

The city of Landsberg is perfectly sized for leisurely visit in just one day. Historical landmarks, art and culture, charming cafes, good restaurants, unique bookstores, and fascinating shops for browsing and shopping offer a variety of options to suit every taste. And in the background, the River Lech gently and steadily flows by. Let us introduce you to some of the highlights around the city and leave you to determine the order!

MUTTERTURM AND HERKOMER MUSEUM

A fairytale tower created by Hubert von Herkomer in honour of his mother. Learn more about the life and work of this exceptional artist at the small yet delightful Herkomer Museum. Enjoy the view from the tower and be sure to savour one of the many homemade cakes at the Herkomer Café.



BÄCKERTOR

One gate, two faces: Stroll through the gate and pay close attention to the structure of the roof. According to a legend, it is believed that the different gables were designed to mislead robbers when trying to escape from the city.



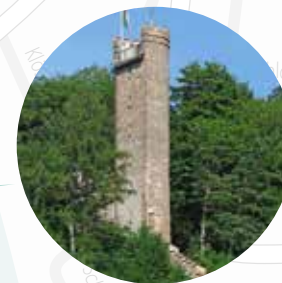
FLÖSSERPLATZ

Until the 19th century, rafts carried heavy loads and goods along the River Lech from Füssen to Augsburg. Today, you can soak up the sun in one of the many cafés or admire the Lech weir. Occasionally, daring canoeists tumble down the cascades.



JUNGFERNSPRUNGTURM

This high half-tower is a reminder of the girls and women who are said to have thrown themselves to their deaths out of fear of the Swedes during the Thirty Years' War. The tower is part of the city wall, which is interrupted here, and offers one of the most beautiful views over the city from the viewing platform.



VORDER- AND HINTERANGER

The Vorderanger and Hinteranger streets in the old town are lined with colourful houses, small boutiques, restaurants, and cafés. The Johanniskirche, an inconspicuous church from the outside, boasts a sumptuous Baroque interior. It was built in the mid-18th century according to plans by Landsberg master builder Dominikus Zimmermann.



PARISH CHURCH OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE VIRGIN MARY

The first church stood here as early as the 12th century. The foundation stone of today's building was laid in 1458. Ulm master builder Matthäus Ensinger was commissioned to design the new basilica.



HISTORIC TOWN HALL

Deliberately built at this precise location, this is one of the city's most beautiful buildings. Passing through the city gate for the first time, you can hardly overlook the beauty and riches of the city. The town hall received its elaborate stucco façade from none other than Dominikus Zimmermann – one of Germany's most famous Rococo master builders.



HIGH CROSS

The High Cross offers a beautiful viewpoint over the northern old town and the western parts of the city. The Great Crucifixion Group dates back to 1857. From here, you can return to the old town through the hillside forest.



BAYERTOR

Our gateway to Munich: The Bayertor is considered to be the largest and most beautiful late Gothic archways in southern Germany. From the top of the tower, there are breathtaking views of the old town to the Lech river and all the way to the Alps.



ALTE BERGSTRASSE

Arts and crafts shops and boutiques line this steep medieval lane adjacent to the 'Hexenviertel', or Witches' Quarter. In the past, it was forbidden to close the front doors of the houses, enabling drivers and pedestrians to dive out of the way of wayward horse-drawn carriages rumbling down the hill.



FUN & JOIE DE VIVRE

Landsberg am Lech regularly occupies top positions in surveys of cities with the highest happiness factor and the best quality of life.

We Landsbergers have known this for a long time, and our visitors soon appreciate why this is the case.

LECH-PROMENADE

In summer, this is definitely the place to promenade in Landsberg. Sitting on the wall with a drink, watching what's going on, meeting people, enjoying an ice cream and just appreciating how lovely it is here.

LIFE ON THE RIVER

Whether sunbathing on Lech beach, canoeing, whitewater rafting or paddle boarding on the reservoirs – the Lech River shapes our city life.

At the first rays of sunshine, people gather on Lech promenade, take picnics at the weir, and meet in the beer garden by the Lech. At the Lechsteg bridge or further up at the English Garden, you often see foil surfers riding the waves.

CULTURE INCLUDED

Culture in Landsberg – diverse, vibrant, high-end! Experience theatre, classical chamber music, jazz, literature, visual arts and much more in the special surroundings of the city theatre, historic town hall and other event locations.

For music lovers there's the summer organ festival and town hall concerts, and for creatives the lechART academy.

In addition, a range of small galleries and many freelance artists complement the lively art scene.

LONG NIGHT OF ART

For more than 20 years now, the historic old town has been transformed into a unique art gallery on one September Saturday. From 6 pm to 11 pm, painting, music and literature can be found behind almost every door, in every one of the small shops. Alternatively, stroll the narrow streets and enjoy open-air events.



CITY THEATRE

Landsberg City Theatre was built in 1878. However, the city's theatrical tradition started in the 17th century. Today, the theatre offers a varied programme, with guest performances from the realms of spoken theatre, dance, cabaret and music, and is home to the s'Maximilaneum cabaret and the cinema „Filmforum“.

TOWN HALL CONCERTS

Behind the magnificent stucco façade of the Historic Town Hall, designed by Dominikus Zimmermann at the beginning of the 18th century, town hall concerts have been held for over 40 years and have been an integral part of the cultural life of the city of Landsberg am Lech ever since. Enjoy performances by world-famous musicians and an array of outstanding events in a special setting.

MULTI-TALENTED AND VISIONARY

Hubert von Herkomer gained fame during his lifetime through his work as a portrait painter of prominent people such as Richard Wagner or Kaiser Wilhelm. Yet access to the high society of the time was not enough to whet Herkomer's creative and visionary appetite. As a sculptor, composer, film-maker, head of his own art academy and pioneer of automotive sport, his influence was wide-ranging. Go in search of traces in the Herkomer Museum.

THE LION**

„Here
I will build a castle.
A castle to protect the area
that Staufen Emperor Friedrich
Barbarossa gave to me in 1156.
It shall be called „Castrum Landes-
purch“. The castle will protect the
bridge over the Lech and bring me
profit if the salt has to pass the Lech
on its way from Reichenhall to
Upper Swabia.“



**LUDWIG
THE BAVARIAN**

„Finally,
I have defeated
Frederick the Fair of Habs-
burg! I will financially strengthen
my border fortress of Landsberg,
which took a serious beating in the
war at the beginning of the 14th
century, and with the salt penny
will partake in the salt cus-
toms revenue.“



DUKE ERNST

„Hunting, relaxing
... Landsberg is simply one
of my favourite cities and has
more than earned the honour of the
Forellentrunk Foundation. In 1434,
all citizens are invited to come to the
well in the town hall tavern with
their women. Later we will head
to the first floor to dance.“



**DOMINIKUS
ZIMMERMANN**

„Landsberg will
be my home. I will involve
myself in the city and become
mayor. This is where I start planning
my Rococo masterpieces: the
Wieskirche church and the pilgrimage
church of Steinhausen. Incidentally,
the fee for my naturalisation was
covered by my decoration of
the town hall.“



IGNAZ KÖGLER

„My father
was furrier on at the
main square when I was born in
1680, but I wanted to go out into the
big wide world. To become a missionary
– that was my dream. As a Jesuit priest
and mathematician, I travelled to China
and became Head of the Astronomi-
cal Observatory – and one of the
most respected foreigners in
Beijing.“



**HUBERT VON
HERKOMER**

„Hopefully,
one life will be enough
for all the things I have in
mind. Painting, drawing, teaching,
making music, designing buildings,
establishing the first motor rally ...
I rightly became an honorary
citizen of the city of
Landsberg in 1883.“

- As of 3500 BC ● The Lechtal is settled.
- Circa 1700 BC ● The first settlers settle on the Schlossberg.
- Around 1135 ● The first mention in writing of the settlement of Phetine on the later Landsberg urban area.
- Around 1160 ● The Bavarian Duke Henry the Lion has a castle, the „Landespurch“, built.
- 1279 ● The first mention of Landsberg am Lech as a city.
- 1315 ● Emperor Ludwig „the Bavarian“ visits Landsberg and grants the right to levy taxes and duties. The city's heyday begins.
- 1425 ● The city wall is expanded and the Bayertor is built as protection to the east.
- 1458-1488 ● Construction of the Parish Church of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary.
- 1618-1648 ● Thirty Years' War: Landsberg's population is dramatically reduced by war and epidemics, and the city is largely destroyed.
- 1699 ● New construction of the town hall on the Hauptplatz.
- 1884-1888 ● The artist Hubert von Herkomer has the residential and studio tower built on the Lech River, calling it the „Mutterturm“.
- 1923-1924 ● Adolf Hitler is imprisoned in Landsberg for treason and writes the first part of „Mein Kampf“.
- 1944-1945 ● In the concentration camps around Landsberg am Lech and Kaufering, thousands of prisoners fall victim to Nazi atrocities.
- As of approx. 2010 ● Landsberg am Lech establishes itself more and more as a city of culture. Many small and large music festivals with international guests are held here.

THE JESUITS

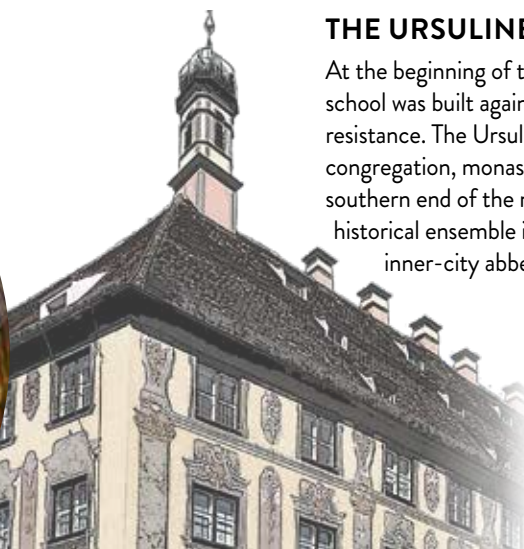
The Church of the Holy Cross is one of the first houses of worship of the Jesuit Order in southern Germany. The preceding building was inaugurated in 1584 after the Jesuits had settled in Landsberg in 1578. The high altar is one of the few surviving from the 18th century.

THE URSULINES

At the beginning of the 18th century, a girls' school was built against initial considerable resistance. The Ursulines founded a women's congregation, monastery and church at the southern end of the main square. Today, this historical ensemble is one of the few preserved inner-city abbeys in Upper Bavaria.

LANDSBERG AND THE VISCONTIS

In 1396, Duke Ernst married Elisabetta Visconti, one of the coveted „hundred thousand guilden daughters“, helping to pay off Bavarian debts with her dowry. Through her marriage, she became the Duchess of the Wittelsbach Territory of Bavaria- Munich. The Visconti coat of arms can be found on the east side of the Bayertor.



BEHIND THE SCENES

A leisurely stroll provides an initial impression of the many attractions on offer in this city on the Lech. But when you take a closer look, under expert guidance, the fascination grows. Want to know more?

THE BAYERTOR

The Bayertor, built in 1425, is one of the most beautiful and best-preserved Gothic city gates in Germany. In the late Middle Ages, it was already the landmark of the city of Landsberg am Lech, welcoming travellers on the former salt road from a distance.

Your visit will start with a short film, which takes you on a brief journey through the tower's eventful history. You will experience fishing yards and battlements, the historic Bayertor clock and, above all, a wonderful view over the city and countryside. In good weather, you can see far into the Alps. Young visitors will have a great time in the children's corner.

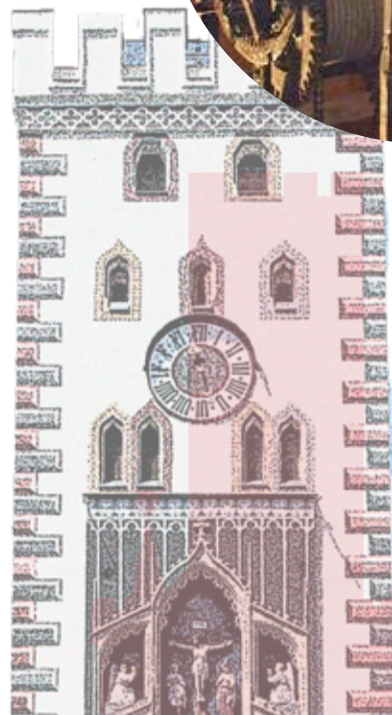

HISTORIC TOWN HALL

The Historic Town Hall is one of the city's most beautiful buildings – not only from the outside. The beauty continues on the inside, with elaborate stucco work by Dominikus Zimmermann greeting us as we enter on the ground floor. The famous Rococo architect and stuccoist was highly sought after throughout southern Germany and also built the Wieskirche near Steingaden. The historical furnishings of the rooms on the upper floors reveal the eventful history of the city, including the work of the old councillors in the Herkomersaal on enormous, lavish paintings.

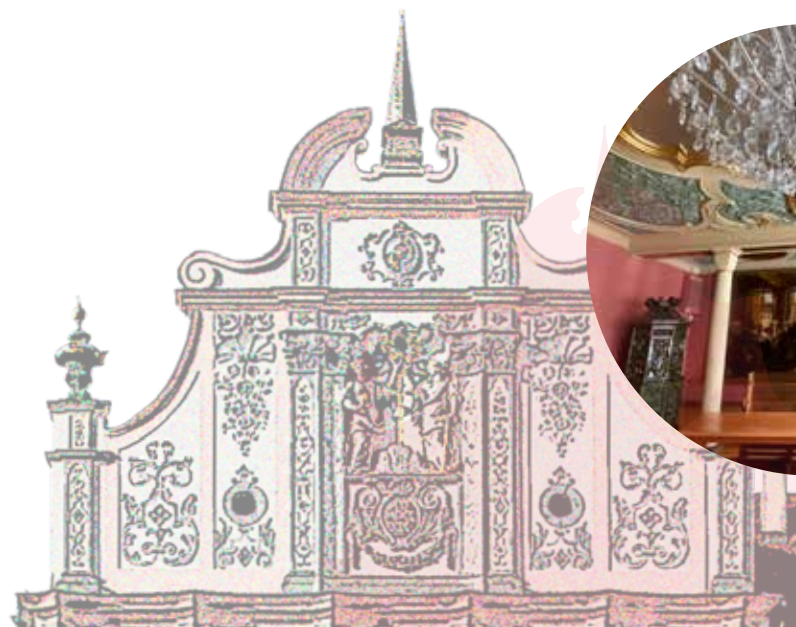

DISTRICTS BETWEEN FIELDS & PASTURES

The urban flair and cultural offerings of Landsberg are surrounded by four rurally influenced districts and the picturesque Sandau: formerly independent villages now incorporated into the city. Cycle paths lead across flowering meadows, fields and forests to churches of art-historical significance, picturesque palaces and listed farmsteads. There are many places full of mystical power to discover.

LANDSBERG AM LECH

SANDAU



SANDAU

In the weathered church in Sandau, the remains of one of Bavaria's oldest churches from 8th century were discovered during archaeological digs. A wild and romantic path begins in Sandau, passing the fish farm, through riverside woodlands forests along the Lech River, leading to a headwater referred to affectionately by locals as the "Congo".

ERPFTING

The focal point of the old village, and of art-historical significance, is the parish church of St Michael. The village centre and many of the farmhouses are now listed as historical monuments. The bike path to Landsberg leads past the Maria Eich chapel. Originally built in wood in 1638, architect Johann Schmuzer from Wessobrunn began construction of the present-day chapel around 60 years later. The frescoes were continued by Johann Baader – the „Lechhansl“ widely known beyond Landsberg.



REISCH

East of Landsberg lies the small town of Reisch, first written mention of which was in 1052. Its small Church of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is worth the visit, and an ancient large-leaved lime tree points the way.



PITZLING

A beautiful hiking and cycling path leads directly to Lech along through the Pössinger Au, past the Devil's Kitchen in Pitzling. The village nestles on a narrow terrace against the slope of the Lech. The Dorfkirche was constructed back in the 13th century. Worth a visit is the small, picturesque Pöring Palace with the adjacent pilgrimage church, designed by Dominic Zimmermann.

ELLIGHOFEN

Idyllically located on the Wiesbach on the border between Upper Bavaria and Swabia, the townscape is shaped by the church of Saint Stephen, the field chapel of Saint Rasso and the 300-year-old Weiß-Egger estate on the outskirts of the village. The historical route of the Via Claudia Augusta also passes through Ellighofen.



HIKING & CYCLING

Various modern cycling and hiking trails follow the course of the river: you're spoilt for choice. Fancy cycling south on the Lech adventure trail and the routes of the „Romantic Road“ towards the Alpine panorama? Or would you rather hike downstream, stop at the Brückenwirt Inn in the next village to rest under the chestnut trees, and finish on the way back at the rushing cascades of the Lechwehr? Not an easy decision!

VIEWS OVER THE CITY AND COUNTRYSIDE

Landsberg am Lech is a great choice for cyclists and hikers – whether as a stopover or the starting point for a wide variety of tours. Start here, for example, with the Lech adventure trail, which consists of five stages leading from Landsberg am Lech to Füssen along with a hike through the magnificent river and lake landscape of the Lech. Natural sections of river, mirrored lakes, cosy villages and historic old towns form the picturesque backdrop to this long-distance hiking trail. Or perhaps you prefer something more modest: a leisurely ramble through the Lechpark to the Teufelsküche, then returning to the historic centre of Landsberg via the Lechhöhenweg?

EXPLORING LANDSBERG BY BIKE

The same applies to cyclists: All along the rushing Lech River there are delightful nature trails both to the north (towards Augsburg via Kaufering and Scheuring) and to the south (towards Füssen via Hohenfurch and Schongau).

Embark on a journey along the newly signposted Lech cycle path, covering 245 km and showcasing diverse landscapes, all the while enjoying the diversity of the wild-flowing river.

COOL AND CLEAR

THE TAMED WILD

Anyone who lives here knows that the Lech changes colour every day. The melting of snow in late spring causes a mass of brown-beige water to rush over the Lech cascades, followed by the return of a peacefully flowing river of deepest green.



WILDLIFEPARK & LECHAUEN

Within walking distance of the old town, a natural recreation area with charming forest, meadow and floodplain landscape has been created by the Lech River, offering many rare animals and plants a home. While children frolic in the water playground, marvel at the free-roaming fallow deer or the piglets in the wild boar enclosure, teenagers can fill their Instagram accounts with images of the bright turquoise glow of the Teufelsschlucht reservoir. And what about their parents? They can reward themselves with a visit to the architecturally award-winning „Devil’s Kitchen“ restaurant and reflect on an enjoyable day.



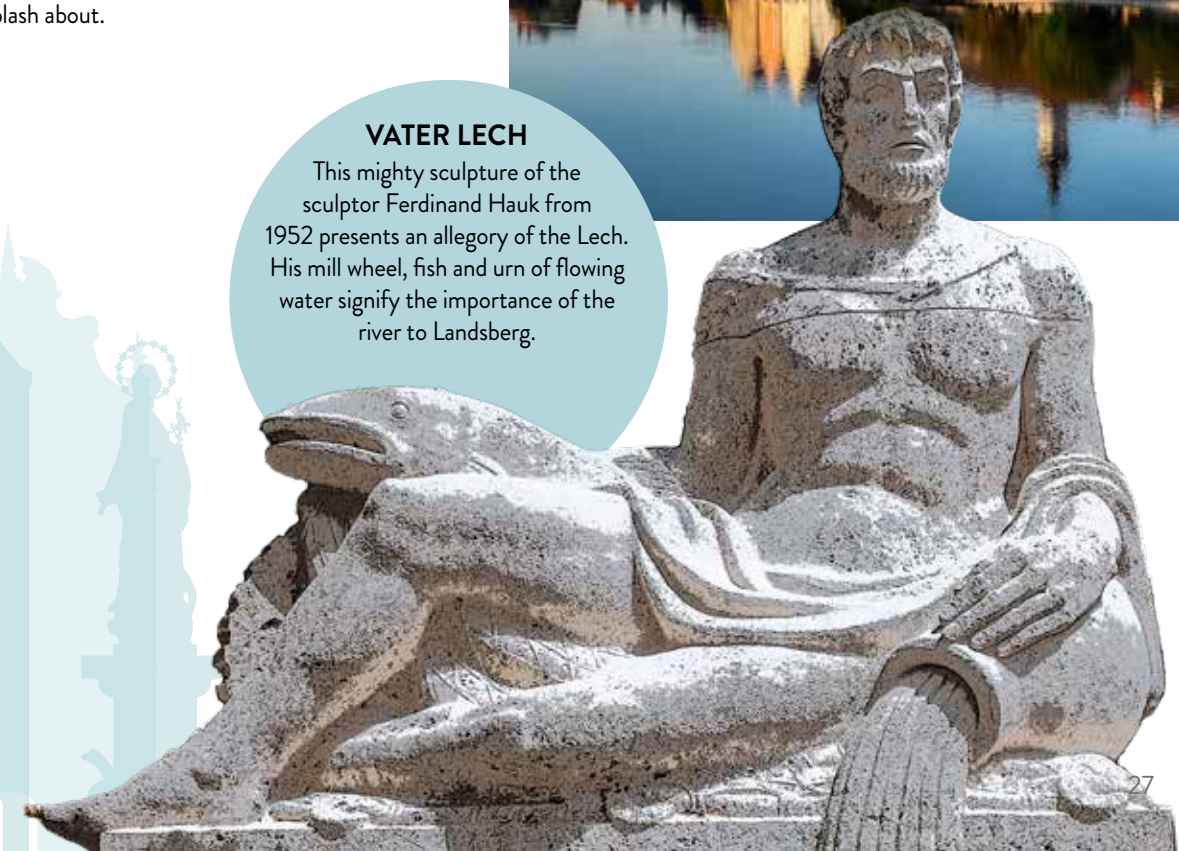
LIFELINE LECH

On warm days, the Lech is often used for bathing. The “Inselbad” pool in the middle of the city has its own, monitored access to the Lech. Alternatively, you can simply relax and drift along on an inflatable. If you prefer sports, you can paddle along the Lech by canoe or SUP. With little effort, you can carry your vessel around the weir. You’ll repeatedly see foil surfers hovering over the Lech. Crossing the Caroline Bridge early in the morning, you can watch fly fishermen below the Lech weir casting their lines, where the trout splash about.



VATER LECH

This mighty sculpture of the sculptor Ferdinand Hauk from 1952 presents an allegory of the Lech. His mill wheel, fish and urn of flowing water signify the importance of the river to Landsberg.



INGENIOUSLY CENTRAL

Landsberg am Lech is centrally located in one of the most beautiful parts of Germany. Here, the Upper Bavarian foothills meet the Swabian region of Bavaria while the artistically inclined Ammersee unites with the rural Lechrain.

Thanks to its central location, all the highlights of Bavaria can be easily reached on a day trip. What's your preference: state capital or alpine idyll?

The picturesque old island town of Lindau invites summer visitors to stroll along the lake promenade. Bregenz with its floating stage and annual festival is just around the corner

WIESKIRCHE

UNESCO World Heritage Site and pilgrimage site in a fantastic location: The „Pilgrimage Church to the Scourged Saviour on the Meadow“ was built by the brothers Baptist and Dominikus Zimmermann. The latter also designed the Historic Town Hall in Landsberg.

NEUSCHWANSTEIN CASTLE

This most famous fairy-tale castle in Germany is located above Hohenschwangau near Füssen. Here, Ludwig II realised his dream of a private refuge. No wonder it became the template for Walt Disney's Cinderella Castle, achieving worldwide fame.

DISTANCE: 63 KM

ZUGSPITZE

Whether by cable car or on foot: Germany's highest mountain is also one of its most impressive destinations. The Zugspitze massif is located southwest of Garmisch-Partenkirchen in the Wetterstein Mountains.

DISTANCE: 86 KM



AUGSBURG

AUGSBURG

This charming university town was shaped by the merchant families of the Fuggers and Welsers. The beautiful old town with the old Fuggerei public housing complex and the various sites of the city's historic water management system, which has been declared a World Heritage Site, are always worth a stroll through the city.

MURNAU AM STAFFELSEE

BLAUES LAND (BLUE COUNTRY)

Hike through the Murnauer Moos, swim in the Staffelsee, explore the old town and visit the Gabriele Münter Museum.

In the summer months, major pioneers of 20th-century expressionist art, such as Wassily Kandinsky and Franz Marc, gathered in the „Blue Country“ and founded „Der Blaue Reiter“, the Blue Rider art movement.

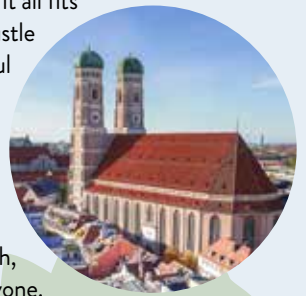
